#### **MLS INFORMATION:**

\*Hot Tip: With daylight getting scarce, a light can sometimes come in handy when you are out on a showing. You may not know this, but your ActiveKEY has a couple of unique features that can help you:

\*Flashlight: To turn on the Flashlight function, turn on your ActiveKEY and press the flashlight button (between UP and DOWN arrows at top of keypad). The flashlight stays on as long as your key stays on.

\*Backlight: To activate the Backlight, turn on your ActiveKEY and press the Light Bulb button on the bottom right of the keypad. As long as the key is on the backlight will stay on also.

\*If you routinely copy yourself on listing email notifications sent to your clients, and you type your email in each time, please read on. Under Preferences - Email, you will find an option to Auto-Fill BCC. If you check this box and Save, each time you send an email or set up a new listing auto-notification, your email will automatically be included as a bcc. For each individual email, you have the option to click the x to remove your email if you so choose. If your email address changes, Paragon will look at the bcc line in your auto-notifications and update your email address automatically. Paragon does not automatically update your email address if you have entered it in the To: or cc: line.

# Tweak to our New Withheld by Seller Status – Monday, September 29

Our new status of *Withheld by Seller* is getting much use, and it appears to have helped to set better expectations regarding showing availability. We have one concern we have received, however, is that it is difficult to find the listings that will be available again for showings among those that have been permanently placed in withdrawn status. In order to correct this, we have made the following change to these very different situations into separate statuses:

WD – Withheld/Delayed - For listings that are newly listed but not yet ready to market. In addition, for listings that have been Active, marketing has been temporarily suspended, and will be Active again. A new date field is required for listings in WD to indicate the date showings will be allowed. If you do not have a proper date, please enter with your best guess. This date can be changed as often as needed. This new date field has been added to the Agent Full report. You will no longer need to make room within the remarks for the date showings will be allowed.

WTH - Withdrawn by Seller - For listings that were on the market, but have been removed from active because the seller no longer wishes to sell. In this situation, the listing broker and seller have not terminated the listing contract. You will no longer need to add anything to

the remarks since the status alone creates the needed alert. If the listing broker and seller terminates their contract before the actual expiration date, the listing should be placed in **Expired** status.

Since listings in WD and WTH are not available for showings, they are blocked from auto-emails from Paragon as well as all public internet sites. Remember- If a listing is in WD or WTH, showings are not allowed for anyone....including the listing agent/office.

The MLS COMMITTEE makes decisions about changes to Paragon, the keycard system, and MLS rules. If you would like to discuss an item you feel would make our MLS better or a reason for it to be changed, please feel free to contact a member of the MLS Committee. Please remember when taking photos of your listings you should take the photos before placing your sign. If that is not possible blur out the sign with your name and office. Your information is not allowed in the photo.

ActiveKey Displays **"Call to Enable"**There are 3 possible causes for the "Call to Enable" message

- 1) The ActiveKey battery is too low (The ActiveKey should be plugged into its power adapter at least every other night for charging)
- 2) The ActiveKey was out of cellular range for 24 hours or more
- 3) There could be a billing problem or a problem with status.

ARE YOU BORROWING OR USING AN ACTIVE KEY THAT IS NOT YOURS? If you are, this can be costly for each of you and the Broker! KEY HOLDER BEWARE!!!!!

If each are key holders,  $1^{st}$  offense Reprimand for all,  $2^{nd}$  offense \$25 fine for each agent and broker and  $3^{rd}$  offense also \$25 fine for each.

If user is a Non-key holder, 1<sup>st</sup> offense \$100 fine for each agent and broker, 2<sup>nd</sup> offense \$500 for each agent and broker, 3<sup>rd</sup> offense \$1000 fine for each agent and broker.

Due to the recent tragic death of a real estate agent, Beverly Carter, Ark. I thought that I might remind you all of some safety tips.

- 1. Enact the CITO (come into the office) rule. Brokers should require salespersons to screen new clients at their office.
- 2. Encourage agents to trust their instincts. Trust your gut and leave. Forget the sale; safety is more important.
- Set up a "buddy system." Travel in pairs or photo or text client's license plate to the agent on floor duty. Set up code words and phrases to speak or text when checking over the phone.
- Safety Education, whether in-house or online or through local or state associations. Real Estate Safety should be a mandatory training for agents.
- 5. Make sure practitioners are safe online too. Online leads are a significant source of business. Search them on Google or do a background check.
- 6. Recommend safety apps and products. There are a lot of apps and security products available. Such as MyForce, GPS Tracker and The Dazzle Defender.
- 7. Insist on professionalism from clients and agents alike. Think about the words used by prospective clients. "If someone compliments your photo, for instance, something is wrong because this is a business relationship," use

professional head shots for your website and never use suggestive photos, full body shots or selfies as they are often too casual and can send the wrong message.

## **Recipe of the Month**

#### **APPLE CRISP**

#### Ingredients:

Sugar-1cup
Water-1/4 cup
Cinnamon ½ tsp
Flour ¾ cup
Salt ¼ tsp (optional)
Butter 6 T



#### **Directions:**

Peel and slice apples. Mix  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar, water & cinnamon in an 8x8/2 inch glass pan. Add the sliced apples. (Mix) Combine  $\frac{1}{2}$  C sugar, with  $\frac{3}{4}$  C flour, salt & 6 T of butter. Mix to resemble pie crust, then sprinkle over the apples. Bake for  $\frac{40}{45}$  min. at  $\frac{375}{2}$ .

#### **YAM CASSEROLE**

#### **Ingredients:**

3-4 cups fresh yams, cooked, drained & mashed

34 cup sugar

½ t cinnamon

½ t nutmea

34 stick butter (soft/melted)

1 cup milk, scalded

3 eggs, beaten

#### **Topping:**

1/2 cup chopped nuts ½ cup brown sugar ½ stick butter, melted 1 cup crushed Cornflakes

#### **Directions:**

Mix all ingredients with an electric mixer, except potatoes. When well mixed, add to potatoes. Mix well. Bake at 325° in buttered 9x13" pan for 30 minutes or until top bubbles. Then spread the topping mixture over the top and bake for 10 more minutes

# Abbreviations: Weights and measurements:

**Macaroni**-1 cup = 2 1/4 cup cooked **Buttermilk**-1 cup 1 or 2 tablespoon vinegar with sweet milk to fill cup (let stand 5 minutes)

**Eggs**-2 large eggs = 3 small eggs
